

Debriefing

- Scale 1a = Extraversion
 - High: Sociable, talkative, active, enjoy crowds and noise, appear cheerful to others
 - Low: Quiet, self-contained, prefer intimate relationships, appear “deep” to others
- Scale 2a = Conscientiousness
 - High: Planful, organized, careful, rule-abiding, detail-oriented
 - Low: Spontaneous, possibly “absent-minded,” like the “big picture, can seem disorganized

Past Findings – Group 1

- “Artists”
 - Low extraversion, Low conscientiousness
 - Will prefer a vacation of spending time alone rather than being in a large group
 - Not likely to have finished planning
 - Will tend to prefer quieter places to noisy ones
 - May do only a few activities, and they might have a hard time envisioning them until they are actually on the vacation
 - May be the most creative but also impractical

Past Findings – Group 2

□ “Scholars”

- Low extraversion, high conscientiousness
- Quiet
- Finish on time
- Like to have plans, fixed schedules
- May prefer vacations where they can spend time alone – prefer deserted beaches to crowded ones
- May like cleaner places (conscientiousness)
- After planning, which they finish early, they might just sit and wait quietly for others to finish

Past Findings – Group 3

□ “Entertainers”

- High extraversion, low conscientiousness
- More lively and louder than the other groups
- Tend to plan to go to crowded places
- Do more risky activities
- Like to do things together
- More physically active
- Prefer spontaneous activities
- May not finish planning
- May say, “We thought maybe we would...” (not precise because they don’t yet know what they want to do!)

Past Findings – Group 4

□ “Leaders”

- High extraversion, high conscientiousness
- Probably do things together on vacation
- Should be less risky than the Low C Extraverts
- In the group, they talk easily and cooperate
- Complete the task
- Good at giving directions
- More likely to have activities well-scheduled
- Finish planning early
- Likely to say, “First we will..., then we will...”
